#### SINGLE BED

**\$975**

*Available in Cherry or Walnut.*

*Dimensions: Rails 75"; 39" Inside Width; 41" Outside Width; 44" High Head; 31 1/4" Foot*

Additional Styles: Double Bed: \$1,030

Queen Bed: \$1,200

Pleasant Hill beds were very distinctive. Although the individual maker might vary the headboard, the overall design and construction were consistent. Original beds usually were fitted for lengthwise slats, however our adaptations are made for modern springs and mattresses. There are several styles of headboards found in the Pleasant Hill collection. Several have the flat vertical spindles seen in this reproduction. These may be found in the Centre Family Dwelling and the Meeting House.

#### TRUNDLE BED

*Available in Cherry or Walnut.*

*Dimensions: Rails 70"; 31 1/2" Inside Width; 33" Outside Width; 14" High Head; 11 1/4" High Foot*

Old-fashioned trundle beds were practical for the Shaker dwelling, especially when several people shared a room. Although very few survive, there are records of the Pleasant Hill Shakers making "low" beds.

#### BED STEP STOOL

*Dimensions: 23 1/2" x 7 1/2" x 6 1/2"*

Storage in tall cupboard and on high shelves made step stools necessary items in Shaker households. These have been adapted for use with high beds. The original is in the Centre Family Dwelling, first floor.

**FOOTSTOOL****\$114***Available in Cherry.**Available for purchase online.**Dimensions: 15 3/4" x 13" x 15 3/4"*

Footstools of various designs are found in the Pleasant Hill collection. This one is extra sturdy and, with its cross-bracing, must have been used in a shop. The original is made of poplar and painted red. Our reproduction is made of cherry. The original may be seen on the second floor of Centre Family Dwelling.

**BLANKET CHEST****\$510***Available in Cherry.**Dimensions: 35" x 17" x 21 1/2"*

One style of a Pleasant Hill blanket chest is reproduced in cherry wood. The original is made of poplar and ash and may be seen on the first floor of the Centre Family Dwelling.

**TWO-PIECE MIRROR****\$160***Available in Cherry or Walnut.**Available for purchase online.**Dimensions: 16" x 3" x 33"*

A reproduction of the Pleasant Hill mirror sconce in the Centre Family Dwelling. A similar mirror with sconce may be found in the Ministry's apartments in the Meeting House. It is said that the mirrors were placed on the sconce during use then put away – to discourage vanity.

**EASEL****\$92***Available in Cherry or Walnut.**Available for purchase online.**Dimensions: 16" x 3" x 33"*

The Shaker mirror sconce, without the mirror, makes a hanging easel for photographs, small paintings or framed mementos.

**WALL CLOCK****\$895***Available in Cherry.**Dimensions: 35" x 11" x 4 1/2"*

This is a reproduction of an Isaac Newton Young wall clock.

**CHEST OF DRAWERS****\$1,700***Available in Cherry.**Dimensions: 40 1/2" x 19" x 42 1/4"*

Unlike the enormous, tall cases of drawers made in Eastern Shaker villages, the Pleasant Hill chests of drawers are scaled to a modern household. This reproduction is made of cherry, as is the original, which is located on the third floor of the Centre Family Dwelling.

**WASHSTAND****\$500***Available in Cherry or Walnut.**Dimensions: 25" x 18 1/2" x 29"*

Reproduction of a Pleasant Hill cherry washstand with lift-top, and cupboard below. The original is exhibited in the Ministry's Dining Room of Centre Family Dwelling.

**DRYING RACK** **\$116**

*Available in Cherry.*  
*Dimensions: 34" x 35"*

All sorts of drying racks were used in Shaker communities--in kitchens, shops, laundries, perhaps in the retiring rooms. This is a reproduction of one of many in the Pleasant Hill collection. The original is located in the first kitchen in Centre Family Dwelling.

**HERB STOOL** **\$200**

*Dimensions: 13" x 23 1/2"*

The tripod stool is adapted from a singular example in the collection. The original, perhaps used as a work bench, can be seen in the Farm Deacon's Shop. Because of its stability and comfort, reproductions are used by the interpretation staff throughout the village.

**LONG BENCH** **\$280**

The original bench can be found in the Centre Family Dwelling.

**JELLY CUPBOARD** **\$980**

*Available in Cherry.*  
*Dimensions: 42" x 16" x 39"*

In cherry wood, this is a handsome reproduction of a New York Shaker small cupboard. The original is made of pine and painted red, the usual practice for shop or kitchen furnishings. The original may be found in the cellar of the Centre Family Dwelling

**CORNER CUPBOARD** **\$1,900**

*Available in Cherry.*  
*Dimensions: 31" x 82"*

This reproduction is an adaptation of two Pleasant Hill cupboards. The originals may be found in the kitchen of the Centre Family Dwelling.

**ROCKING CHAIR** **\$625**

*Painted Red or Blue with Taped Seat.*  
*Dimensions: 35" x 24 1/2" x 45", Seat 16" x 20"*

The armed rocker is adapted from one of several classic examples in the Pleasant Hill collection.

**LADDER-BACK CHAIRS** **\$280**

*Painted Red or Blue with Taped Seat.*  
*Dimensions: 18" x 14 1/2" x 40 1/2"*

A sturdy adaptation of Pleasant Hill ladder-back, or common, chairs. The classic Pleasant Hill finial on the back posts is one of its distinctive features. Although the Shakers used different materials for the seats, one of the most durable was the woven tape. Various examples of original Pleasant Hill common chairs are seen throughout the exhibition areas in the village.

**LARGE DROP LEAF TABLE WITH 10" LEAVES** **\$995**

*Available in Cherry.*

*Dimensions: 55" x 42" x 29"*

**SMALL DROP LEAF TABLE** **\$700**

*Available in Cherry.*

*Dimensions: 36" x 26" x 29"*

Drop leaf tables are not common Shaker forms, but several have been attributed to Pleasant Hill. Practical adaptation was a characteristic of Pleasant Hill furniture making. The original is made of cherry and is currently in storage.

**WRITING DESK** **\$480**

*Available in Cherry.*

*Dimensions: 30" x 29-1/2" x 23"*

A reproduction of one of the more refined one-drawer work tables made by the Pleasant Hill Shakers. The original was acquired at auction in 1991 with a strong provenance and is characteristic of Pleasant Hill furniture makers. It can be found in the Ministry's Dining Room of Centre Family Dwelling.

**LIFT-TOP SEWING TABLE** **\$370**

*Available in Cherry.*

*Dimensions: 28" x 19" x 28"*

Although the original table, exhibited in the Centre Family Dwelling, is also made of cherry, it was at one time painted, or stained, red. Perhaps used as a small sewing table by Shaker sisters, the lift-top makes this a versatile table at any time.

**ONE-DRAWER OCCASIONAL TABLE** **\$340**

*Available in Cherry or Walnut.*

*Dimensions: 26 3/4" x 19" x 27 1/4"*

A reproduction of one of the most handsome tables in the Pleasant Hill collection, the original is exhibited in the Ministry's Dining Room of the Centre Family Dwelling. A typical feature of Pleasant Hill tables, or one drawer stands, is that the drawer fits directly under the table top, with no intervening rail.

**SATURDAY TABLE** **\$300**

*Available in Cherry or Walnut.*

*Dimensions: 19 1/2" x 17" x 27 3/4"*

A reproduction of a singular Pleasant Hill table. The original comes with an oral tradition of being called a Saturday Table, to account for its unusual size and shape, and the assortment of materials. It is said that such pieces were made on Saturdays in the shops for the purpose of using up odds and ends of wood, so that there would be no waste. There is, however, no documentation for this interesting story. The original is made of walnut and poplar and is located in the Meeting House, Ministry's apartments.

**TRIPOD TABLE, ALSO CALLED CANDLE STAND TABLE** **\$290**

*Available in Cherry or Walnut.*

*Dimensions: 16 1/2" x 26" x 26 1/2"*

One of the most distinctive Pleasant Hill tables, the cherry candle stand has much in common with traditional American tripod stands. Several of the original stands are to be seen in Centre Family Dwelling. Our reproductions also are made in walnut.

Adjustable sconces were useful in the Shaker household for placing lighting wherever needed. These items are reproduced from two of many styles in the Pleasant Hill collection. The original of Shelf Sconce is made of tulip poplar and may be seen on the first floor of Centre Family Dwelling. Also located there is the original of the Round Sconce which is made of cherry.

**PEG BOARD**

Peg boards, sometimes called pin rails, were everywhere in a Shaker village. They were handy for hanging clothing, lighting, tools, and even small pieces of furniture.
