Habitats

Shaker Village's 3,000 acres offers a variety of natural habitats, from open grasslands which cover large areas, to savanna zones and forests, to ponds and streams which are wet or dry depending on the season.

Shaker Village seeks to preserve, conserve and restore native habitats, plant species and other elements of Kentucky's natural environment.

Peak Wildflower Season

Spring wildflower blooming season at the village runs from February through early June, with peak blooms in mid-April. Late-June brings spectacular summer varieties.
